

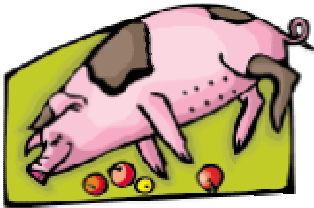

Working Share Members - Currently we have a few more working shares available and would like to have them filled before the next crop comes in.

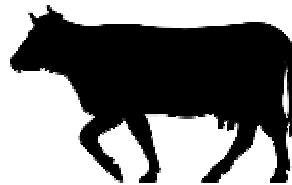
Charities - Last year we donated 2000lbs (1 ton) of food to charity and are interested helping more! If you **belong** to a charity

Bulls and Cows

When traveling with the kids, it is often a puzzle as to how to keep them busy. So on your next trip to the farmer's market, try this game on for size!

This game is played with two people and all you need is a paper and pen! Each person has to choose a 'secret' number containing four digits that differ. Next each person takes a turn at guessing the other's number. When a number is in the correct position it is considered a 'bull' but if the correct number is in the wrong position they are considered 'cows'.

So Player 1 chooses the 'secret' number of 1537 and the second player then guesses 1234, this means there are two bulls and no cows. Suppose the next guess is 1235, there are now two bulls and one cow. The game continues until someone's 'secret' number is revealed.

Since the person with the first guess has an advantage, they usually go second in the next round.

Consider this game the 'Master Mind' of the farm!
